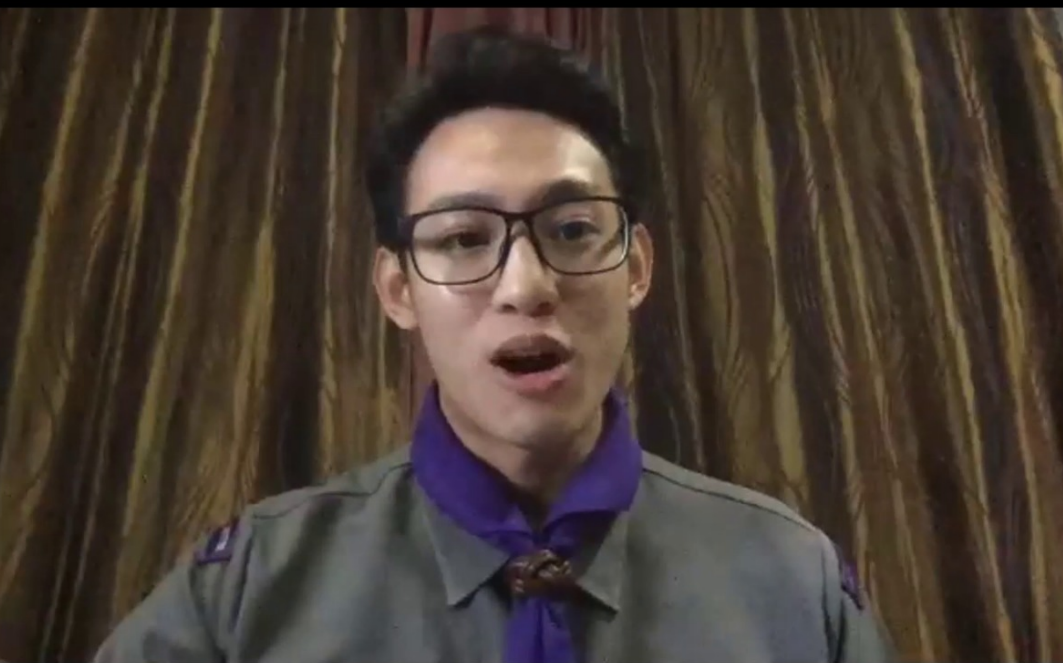

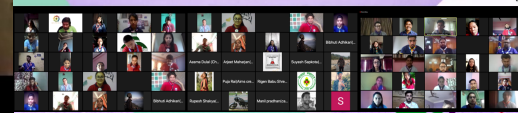

DAY 6 RECOMMENDATION PRESENTATION

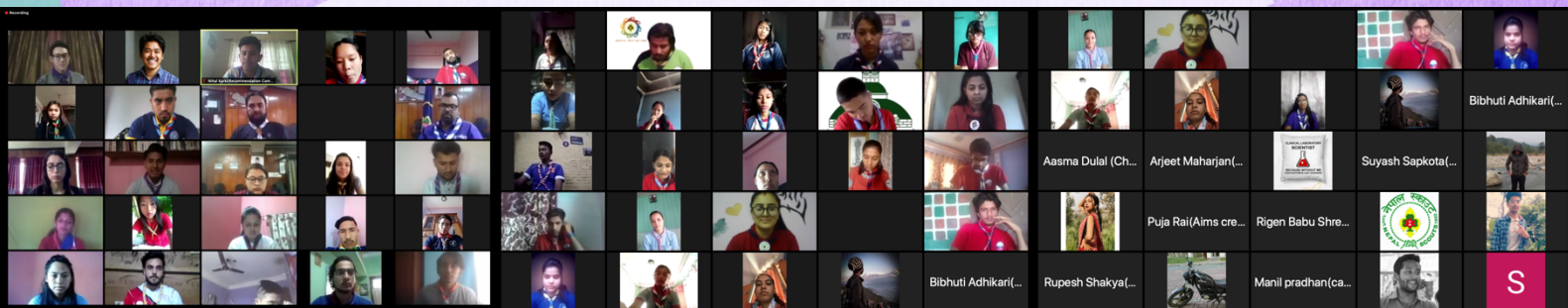

Mr. Binit Chanttyal, Chair, Steering Committee, started the session with an inspiring quote followed by the announcement of the day.

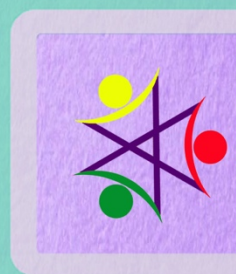
Mr. Nihal Karki, Member, Steering Committee, presented the reflection of previous day.
